- 5) **Public Comments** – Community member Elizabeth Savage shared that she is concerned about the process of reconfiguring of the VCAAA and urges that California Department of Aging (CDA) and VCAAA work together with the in the open for a full collaboration in the upcoming changes. Elizabeth also affirmed she will be sending her public comment to CDA as well. Dr. Karen Gorback shared that she has published her book, “Meshbokah”, which is the Hebrew word for family. Dr. Gorback’s book can be purchased online. Stephanie Belding shared that VCAAA’s Workforce Committee is hosting a job fair on Wednesday, January 21<sup>st</sup> at the Goebel Adult Community Center in Thousand Oaks from 9 AM to 1 PM in collaboration with Goebel’s Wellness Fest. Blair Barker shared that last month’s Caregiver Symposium had well over 100 attendees and was a

success with about 95% of attendees who provided feedback sharing that they enjoyed the symposium.

**7) HSA Leadership Update** – Monique Nowlin shared a reminder that HAS/VCAAA is hosting the Transition Stakeholder Forum on January 28<sup>th</sup> at 10 AM in the Pepper Tree room at 855 Partridge Drive office in Ventura. Interested attendees must register online. The FAQ's (Frequently Asked Questions) will be posted in the next few days on the VCAAA website.

**8) Presentation: Notable Notes from the Workforce Development Board** – Chair Dr. Munguia gave a warm introduction to council member and Workforce Committee Chair, Stephanie Belding, who gave an expansive presentation on the knowledge, information and resources gained from attending recent Workforce Development Forum hosted by the Workforce Development Board of Ventura County. The resource-packed presentation was sent to the council members following the meeting.

**9) Presentation: Caregiver Coalition** – Chair Dr. Munguia shared an enthusiastic introduction of council member and Family Caregiver Focused Population representative, Maureen Hodge. Maureen, who currently manages a grant specific to caregivers through Community

Memorial Hospital, also collaborates with multiple local organizations in an effort to enhance services for caregivers in Ventura County. Maureen gave a warmhearted presentation on the Caregiver Coalition and the work they do. The presentation was sent to the council members following the meeting.

- 10) **CSL Elections/Executive Committee Elections Discussion –** Chair Dr. Munguia shared information about the upcoming California Senior Legislature (CSL) and Executive Committee Elections. At the next meeting in March, a Nominating Committee will be selected. The Committee will do their work and present the slate of Nominees and hold the elections in May. Executive Committee Vice-Chair Martha Shapiro shared that it is the hope of the Executive Committee that the new administrator of AAA will take the Advisory Council as is for continuity and that is why they felt so strongly about going forth with the elections.
  
- 11) **HSA Communications Manager Update –** Communications Manager Roger Horne went through the process of registering online (for either in-person or virtual) for the Stakeholder Forum taking place on January 28<sup>th</sup> and the check-in process on the day of the meeting. He also gave the reminder that registration will close at noon the day before the meeting (January 27<sup>th</sup>). Roger also shared year-end 2025 numbers: 221 total outreach events recorded, with almost half of those being HICAP presentations.
  
- 12) **Other Committee Meetings:**
  - a. **California Senior Legislature (CSL) Update –** The CSL gave a presentation on the mission of the CSL and what they do as applications are now open for the CSL vacancies. CSL representatives research solutions to problems, put them in right format, talk to the elected legislators to gain sponsorship to those proposals, turn them into bills and then have them heard in the legislature. If the bill(s) get through the legislature, they go to the Governor for signing. The presentation was sent out to the council members following the meeting.
  - b. **VCAAF Foundation Update –** James Schicker shared that VCAAF visited some of the congregate meal sites. They chose 4 of the 12 sites to visit (varying size to get a good representation). The 4 sites that were visited were Santa Paula, Oxnard, Thousand Oaks and Simi Valley. James also shared that VCAAF is giving \$500 to each of the 12 meal sites for a total of \$6,000. VCAAF is also partnering with LGBT+ Aging Coalition to provide training at all the meal sites on how to be more inclusive.

**c. LGBT+ Aging Coalition** – Dr. Berkowsky shared that LGBT+ Aging Coalition tabled at two events in recognition of Transgender Day of Remembrance to support trans elders and the trans community across the life course. The Coalition also shared reminder that they continue to offer a free 90-minute LGBT+ friendly business training to any business in the County that serves older adults. The Coalition meets on the second Thursday of every month on Zoom from 2 to 3 PM for anyone interested in attending.

**d. Dementia Friendly Ventura County (DFVC)** – Jason Sagar announced that Denise Noguera-Valenzuela will be taking over as Facilitator of the DFVC meetings. The next meeting is scheduled for February 4. The mission of DFVC remains to spread awareness of the many forms of dementia and to get local businesses dementia-friendly trained.

## Key Discussion Points

### 1. Adoption of Agenda

- Agenda was reviewed and adopted with motion by Tony Gitt and second by Carol Leish.
- Brief discussion on procedural rules; Al Brown offered guidance on parliamentary process.

### 2. Status of ADRC and AAA Transition

- Ventura County AAA will not continue as administrator after June 30, 2026.
- CDA will conduct an RFP process to select a new AAA provider; goal is to have a provider in place by July 1, but timeline is uncertain.
- ADRC designation will end July 1; redesignation process takes up to 18 months.
- Funding allocated to Ventura County will return to CDA pool; no guarantee of future funding.
- Potential gaps in ADRC services likely; AAA services may also face delays unless CDA rolls over contracts.
- Senate Bill 1249 prioritizes AAA being housed within county government; neighboring counties have first right of refusal.

### 3. Committee Actions and Letters

- Draft letter to CDA was shared; purpose is to advocate for:
  - Continuation of ADRC services.
  - Commitment from new AAA to partner with ACC.
  - Emergency relief or transitional funding to avoid service gaps.
- Consensus: Submit letter to CDA and later to new AAA provider.

- Deadline for comments on draft letter: January 28, 2026.
- Finalized letter to be circulated for signatures by end of January.

#### **4. Goals for Next Six Months**

- Priority: Advocate for ADRC continuity and funding.
- Engage stakeholders and legislators to support efforts.
- Prepare additional letters and outreach strategies.
- Monitor CDA RFP process and share updates.

#### **5. Scheduling Future Meetings**

- Next official meeting: March 18, 2026.
- Tentative additional meeting: February 18, 2026 (1:00–2:00 PM), pending outcome of January 28 stakeholder forum.

## Key Discussion Points

### 1. CDA Letter – ADRC Continuation

- Updated draft letter to the California Department of Aging (CDA) was reviewed.

- Letter expresses support for continuation of ADRC services and partnership with Access Central Coast.
- Committee feedback has been incorporated into a revised draft.
- Signature placeholders added; affiliation will be verified
- Letter will be circulated via Adobe Sign for digital signatures

### 2. Legislative Update – Proposed ADRC “Fix-It” Bill

- Alexa Martin-Eisenberg provided update on proposed state legislation.
- Bill would create a 2-year transition period to preserve ADRC designation and funding during AAA transition.
- Includes urgency clause for implementation by July 1, 2026.
- No additional state funding required; preserves existing allocation.
- Without legislative action, Ventura County would lose ADRC designation and funding.
- Bill number pending; deadline approaching.
- Tony Gitt offered to pursue California Senior Legislature sponsorship.
- Committee discussed preparing support letters to local legislators once bill number is assigned.

### 3. Letter to Newly Selected AAA Nonprofit

- Chair drafted second letter to be sent to the nonprofit selected as new AAA. Expressing support for continued ADRC partnership and offers collaboration during transition.
- Draft will be circulated for committee review and edits prior to distribution.

#### 4. CDA RFP Timeline Update

- Revised RFP dates reported:
  - April 1, 2026 – RFP submissions due
  - April 8, 2026 – Notice of Intent to Award

#### 5. ADRC Operations Update

- Quarter 3 training completed; including IHSS updates and presentation from Diversity Collective.
- Quarterly training model will continue; Quarter 4 planning underway.
- ACC offered to prepare 2025 ADRC partnership report highlighting service data and outcomes.
- ADRC partnership budget approximately \$350,000.
- ACC operates offices in Thousand Oaks and Ventura.

#### 6. CSU Channel Islands Capstone Research Project

- Chair shared that a team of six at CSUCI students will conduct qualitative interviews with aging services leaders regarding AAA transition.
- IRB approval pending; interviews anticipated late March through early May.
- Final report expected mid-May 2026.
- Committee members may be contacted to participate once approval is granted.

### **Key Discussion Points**

#### **1. VC AAA Transition Update**

- VC AAA transition has been paused; timeline for transfer of services delayed.
- Board of Supervisors approved temporary funding (~\$1.2M) to maintain operations.
- Staffing changes noted; some staff reassigned or departed, but no additional changes anticipated at this time.
- RFP for new AAA provider has been cancelled/withdrawn.
- Committee emphasized importance of maintaining continuity of services during this period.

#### **2. Legislative Update – ADRC “Fix-It” Bill (SB 1261)**

- Alexa Martin-Eisenberg reported continued progress on the statewide bill.
- Urgency clause remains appropriate; bill intended to preserve ADRC funding statewide.
- Executive Director scheduled to testify on April 6 in Sacramento.
- Tony Gitt encouraged members to submit letters of support to Senator John Laird.
- California Senior Legislature expected to vote on submitting a formal support letter.
- Committee discussed sharing template language to support community advocacy efforts.

#### **3. ADRC Operations & Staffing**

- ADRC services continue to operate as usual despite transition pause.
- Cross-training underway to support ADRC and Information & Assistance (I&A) services.
- Existing ADRC team structure remains in place.
- Offer made to provide additional ADRC presentations for newly cross-trained staff.

#### **4. Goals & Priorities for Upcoming Year**

· **Community Outreach & Education**

- Increase awareness of ADRC and “No Wrong Door” access point.
- Promote services, especially in East County (e.g., Thousand Oaks office).
- Potential outreach through local media (Acorn, Star, Breeze articles).

· **Advocacy Efforts**

- Continue support for SB 1261 through letters and community engagement.

· **Data Collection & Research**

- CSU Channel Islands potential summer research project (SURF program) to assess ADRC service usage and community needs.
- Possible survey development combining prior VC AAA (2019) and Santa Paula Master Plan data.
- Align survey with California Master Plan for Aging goals.

**5. Service Awareness & Communication Gaps**

· Community confusion reported regarding:

- Available services
- Service reductions (e.g., transportation/medical rides)
- Status of AAA and ADRC programs

· Recommendation to:

- Develop a clear, simplified list of current services
- Identify services reduced or eliminated due to funding constraints
- Improve public-facing materials and FAQs

· Suggestion to coordinate with HSA and VC AAA Advisory Council for updated, user-friendly materials.

**6. Outreach & Resource Development**

· Potential development of:

- Updated ADRC informational materials
- FAQ or summary sheets for public distribution
- Website resource enhancements

· Existing ADRC website includes:

- Overview of services
- County-specific ADRC navigation
- Contact information for assistance

**7. Future Planning & Sustainability**

- Local and potentially non-local organizations

- Need for early planning rather than waiting for future RFP cycles
- Committee emphasized importance of:
  - Long-term stability
  - Adequate transition timelines
